Tip 'n Toss, Show Them Who's Boss!

Use the checklist ✓ on the back to look for anything that can hold at least a teaspoon of water. When you find the items, you can choose one of three options:

- Toss it.
- Tip water out and and store the container in a dry place.
- For larger items, such as a fountain, empty or replace with fresh water weekly.

Small Bites. Big Threats.

When the common house mosquito (*Culex*) bites, it can spread **West Nile virus** disease. Each year, West Nile virus makes people sick in Southern California, including San Gabriel Valley.


The invasive *Aedes* mosquitoes can spread:

You can prevent this from happening. Tip 'n toss stagnant water and don't forget to put on insect repellent when outdoors!
