President Jamie Bissner called the meeting to order at 7:00 A.M.

### 2. Pledge of Allegiance and Silent Roll Call

District Manager Kenn Fujioka led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Kenn reported that at the June meeting of the Baldwin Park City Council discussion regarding the city's annexation to the District was continued to the July 20, 2016 City Council meeting agenda which he plans to attend.

Kenn Announced he would attend the MVCAC Summer meeting on July 21, 2016 in Santa Ana.

### 10. Disease Surveillance - All Three Invasive Aedes Mosquitoes Now Present in the District

Scientific Programs Manager Wakoli Wekesa reported that the first West Nile virus-positive bird in our District was found in the city of Altadena.

Wakoli summarized the recent history of invasive Aedes in the District: Aedes notoscriptus was discovered in June 2014 in the City of Monterey Park and recently in Alhambra. In late 2015 Aedes albopictus was discovered in the city of Alhambra. For the first time in this District Aedes aegypti was found in the city of Alhambra making Alhambra the first city in this district to have all three species of invasive Aedes.

Wakoli stated that to date 18 cities in this District are infested with *Ae.* albopictus. All three invasive *Aedes* are vectors of chikungunya, dengue, and Zika viruses and one or all of these viruses may be locally transmitted in the District.

He informed the Board that we are working to develop new strategies to manage these invasive species and improve our current methods. Wakoli urged residents take personal precautions to minimize mosquito bites and not allow mosquitoes to proliferate on their properties. He also stated it was important that residents travelling to endemic areas of these diseases report to their doctor or the L.A. County Dept. of Public Health if they become ill. He

mentioned that the District will provide courtesy inspections and follow ups for residents that have potentially been exposed.

Wakoli also informed the Board of the ongoing outbreak of yellow fever in Angola and the Democratic Republic of Congo and the potential for an imported case into Los Angeles County. He will keep the Board apprised.

He mentioned that we anticipate purchasing equipment for testing for these viruses and will begin tests in November.

### 11. Trustee Reports

Trustees Nelson and Sham thanked Public Information Officer Jason Farned for his presentations at the Sierra Madre and Alhambra City Council meetings respectively.

Trustee Sternquist commented on the importance of the District's efforts to alert parents and children about what is being done here at the District through social media.

Trustee Kirby complimented Trustee Finlay for her response to the media regarding the recent fire in Duarte.

Trustee Sternquist requested a moment of silence for the policemen who died in Dallas.

Trustee Spence would not be able to attend Board meetings until he has recovered from injuries in a car accident. No further information was available. The Board will be apprised accordingly.

### 12. New Business

None

President Bissner announced that the Finance Committee would meet immediately after the Board adjourned.

### 13. Adjournment Motion:

No motion. The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 AM.

Black flies present

Seven mosquito pools collected in the District were positive for WNv. The positive cities include: Arcadia, Pomona, San Gabriel and West Covina. In California, 1,487 mosquito pools from 30 counties have been WNv-positive during 2016; 106 were collected in Los Angeles County.

### II. Dead Birds

Two dead birds tested positive for WNv in the District during the month of July. The birds were collected from Altadena and Monrovia. In California for 2016, 764 dead birds from 26 counties tested positive for WNv including 50 from Los Angeles County.

### III. Sentinel Chicken Sera

No sentinel chickens have tested positive for WNv in the District. In California during 2016 there were 73 WNv positive chickens from 11 counties including 10 in Los Angeles County.

### IV. Human Illness

Three cases of human illness with WNv have been confirmed in California in 2016. One case has been confirmed in Los Angeles County (not in the District).


### 3. Underground Storm Drain Project

Our collaborative effort with the Greater LA County Vector Control District (Greater LA) to conduct inspections and treatments in the city of El Monte continued through July. Greater LA inspected 110 drains and treated 89. Our three member team inspected 35 drains and treated 20. With three consecutive months of data for this storm drain system, we were able to identify "hot spots" that continuously produce mosquitoes. We also identified new drains that were breeding but were previously only holding water.

Along with the inspections and treatments in El Monte, we also completed inspecting the underground system in the city of Temple City where we inspected 76 drains and treated 18.

The drain system in the city of El Monte continues to have mostly stagnant water, which produces mosquitoes. The drain system in city of Temple City has mostly flowing water or dry drains because of the hilly terrain. This condition minimizes the chances of mosquito breeding since water moves debris and many drains are dry once this occurs. If debris remains, summer's skyrocketing temperatures cause stagnant water to produce mosquitoes which makes it necessary to treat a higher number of drains.

In August, we will focus our efforts in West Covina and Pomona where four samples of mosquitoes infected with West Nile virus (WNv) were collected. We hope that our inspections and treatments will produce a noticeable decrease in the number of mosquitoes. We anticipate that WNv will continue to surface in our district, and as time and resources permit, the underground team will inspect and treat those areas where the virus is present. We will also continue our joint effort with Greater LA in the city of El Monte.





### 2. Comments

The success of enforcing the District's abatement program is not expressed as the number of properties that are seen by the Committee. These represent the most egregious offenders. Our vector control specialists report that the combination of using the abatement process and the residents knowing that they can actually appear before the Board causes previously recalcitrant ones to take pause.

From the data below, five letters were sent this past month requesting access for property inspections; four were successful and one required a warrant. Inspections were completed on all properties. Three Notices of Violations were issued and, no Notices of Correction or Notices of Public Nuisance were sent. This represents

considerably less time spent than in late 2015, when we sent out 26 letters requesting access and received 16 positive responses, but required 10 warrants.

As we continue using and refining the abatement process, we hope that the number of letters we must send and the number of properties we must refer to the Committee continue to decrease. This is becoming increasingly important as we try to optimize using our resources wisely in the face of the fixed ceiling of our assessment and increasing problems with vectors and the diseases they transmit.

### Background

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every local government agency must have a Conflict of Interest Code (Code). Agencies must amend their Code when necessary pursuant to Government Code Section 87306. According to the Political Reform Act of 1974, the Board of Supervisors is the body that reviews and approves Codes for Los Angeles County.

On July 19, 2016 the Board of Supervisors adopted the District's amended Code and recommends that you approve them (Attached). These include:

- 1. The Incorporation page is modified to include positions which will file directly with the Executive Office.
- 2. Exhibit A is modified with a footnote for Consultants/New Positions.
- 3. The Assistant Manager is deleted because it no longer exists.
- 4. The disclosure of the Fleet Mechanic is expanded because of the position's ability to influence and/or make purchases.
- 5. Adds Board of Trustees; Operations Manager; Scientific Program Manager; Office Manager; Fleet Mechanic; Public Information Officer; and Consultants/New Positions to the code.

### Incorporation of FPPC Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) by Reference

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated into the conflict of interest code of this agency by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibits) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict of interest code of this agency.

### Place of Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Board of Trustees and the District Manager and forward the originals of such statement to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

### **EXHIBIT "A"**

### **CATEGORY 1**

Persons in this category shall disclose all interest in real property within the jurisdiction. Real property shall be deemed to be within the jurisdiction if the property or any part of it is located within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned or used by the agency.

Persons are not required to disclose a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence; however, a residence in which a person rents out a room or for which a person claims a business deduction may be reportable.

### **CATEGORY 2**

Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, investments, and income (including gifts, loans and travel payments).

### **CATEGORY 3**

Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, investments in, or income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) received from business entities that manufacture, provide or sell service and/or supplies of a type utilized by the agency and associated with the job assignment of designated positions assigned to this disclosure category.

### **CATEGORY 4**

Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interest in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individuals who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information advice, recommendation or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interest shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act's exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the District Manager or his or her designee of the agency (See footnote in Exhibit "B" for clarification).

A RESOLUTION OF THE OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES APPROVING AN APPLICATION TO INITIATE PROCEEDINGS TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE DISTRICT AND TAKING CERTAIN CONNECTED ACTIONS

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District (the "District") proposes to initiate proceedings to annex (the "Proposed Annexation") certain territory (the "Territory") generally described as the area within the boundaries of the City of South Pasadena (the "City") to the District.

WHEREAS, the Proposed Annexation is being proposed pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, being Division 3 of Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Section 56000).

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION1 Pursuant to Section 56654 of the Government Code, the Board hereby finds:

- (i) This proposal is made pursuant to Part 3 of Division 3 of Title 5 of the California Government Code.
- (ii) The nature of this proposal is to make an application by resolution of the Board to initiate proceedings to annex the Territory to the District.
- (iii) The boundaries of the Territory proposed to be annexed to the District are generally described as the boundaries of the City and are more particularly described in a map and a general description, attached here as Exhibit A.
- (iv) The proposed terms and conditions for the Proposed Annexation and Amended Sphere of Influence are that the Territory shall be subject to the payment of such fees, rates, charges, assessments, or taxes as the District may legally impose and that any fees, rates, charges, assessments, or taxes for the District shall be payable in the same manner and at the same time and in the same installments as the general taxes of the District on real property are payable.
- (v) The Proposed Annexation will enable the District to provide services (the "Services") to the City to reduce vector populations and risk of vector borne diseases.


SECTION 3 The Board hereby approves the application to initiate proceedings for the Proposed Annexation and Amended Sphere of Influence in the form on file with the District Secretary, together with changes or additions the District Manager deems necessary or appropriate, and authorizes the District Manager to execute and deliver all necessary documents and instruments and to do all things which the District Manager may deem necessary to implement this Resolution.

SECTION 4 The Board requests the Local Agency Formation Commission of Los Angeles County to proceed with the Proposed Annexation and Amended Sphere of Influence pursuant to Part 3 of Division 3 of Title 5 of the California Government Code.

SECTION 5 The District Secretary shall certify the passage and adoption of this resolution and shall file a certified copy with Local Agency Formation Commission of Los Angeles County.

Expanding Distribution of Invasive Aedes in the District

### **Background**

On June 27, 2016 Aedes eggs were collected at two locations in the City of Monterey Park; additional collections were made on July 5, 2016. Larvae hatched from eggs collected on both dates were identified as Aedes aegypti.

Monterey Park becomes the second city in our District after Alhambra to be infested with Ae. aegypti. This expands the distribution of Ae aegypti further to the east since it was discovered in the jurisdiction of the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District in 2014. They have located Ae aegypti in several cities including Commerce, Florence, La Mirada, Los Angeles, Maywood, Pico Rivera, and South Gate, and in the community of East Los Angeles. The speed of their expansion in other counties has been equally breathtaking. To date Ae. aegypti has been found in Alameda, Fresno, Imperial, Kern, Madera, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Mateo and Tulare counties (Attachment 1).

Aedes notoscriptus was discovered on June 5, 2014 in the City of Monterey Park and recently was found in multiple locations in the city of Alhambra. Aedes albopictus has also been found in both cities, making them the two cities in California to officially have all three species of invasive Aedes.

The city of Sierra Madre became positive for *Ae. albopictus* on June 6, 2016, and we now have two additional cities added to the tally. On July 18, 2016 we collected eggs from locations in the city of San Dimas and the community of Altadena, and on July 25, 2016 eggs were collected again from these locations and an additional address in the city of La Verne. Larvae hatched from these eggs were confirmed to be *Ae. albopictus*. These findings expand the distribution of *Ae. albopictus* in our District so that the only cities where it has *not* been identified are Claremont, Pomona, and Walnut (see attached chart and map- attachments 2 and 3).

Aedes aegypti and Ae. albopictus, and potentially Ae. notoscriptus are vectors of chikungunya, dengue, and Zika viruses. These diseases may cause severe illness in people. There is a major possibility that one or all of these viruses may be locally transmitted in the District.

As I write, Zika virus is actively being transmitted in a neighborhood of Miami, Florida. So far there are over a dozen cases of Zika and the CDC has issued a rare travel warning to pregnant mothers visiting the area. Based on the dynamics of this disease, despite active measures being taken additional cases will be identified in this or other areas in the coming weeks. There already are thousands of cases of Zika in Puerto Rico. We must take all preventive measures before Zika and the other two viruses are transmitted locally. This includes developing new strategies of managing invasive *Aedes* and constantly improving current methods.

If a resident recently travelled to areas where these diseases are endemic they must take precautions to avoid mosquito bites once they return home, and let their doctor and/or the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health know if they become sick.

We will as part of the county's Zika prevention and response plan provide courtesy inspections and follow ups for all returning residents that may have potentially been exposed to these viruses.

Please use and share this information regarding the extent of our District's infestation of invasive *Aedes*. We will continue to provide updates.


